## Knitting Pattern by Moth and Rust

I love bobbles, and this quirky little hat is covered in them. A little traditional, a little modern, inspired by new life and buds in the spring and St. Patty's Day.

## Materials:

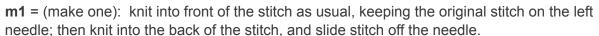
- Cascade 220, Color: 2438, Spring Meadow (or any worsted weight yarn - Wool Ease works great, too!)
- US 5 double pointed needles
- US 7 double pointed needles
- US 7 circular 16" needles
- Tapestry needle



CO = cast on

sts = stitches

 $\mathbf{k} = \text{knit}$ 



**mb** = make bobble: m1, m1 (you should now have 4 stitches where there were two); turn work, k4, turn work, k4, turn work, k2tog, k2tog (you should now be back to to two stitches).

**ssk** = slip, slip, knit: slip one stitch knit wise, slip the next stitch purl wise, then knit the two slipped stitches together

**k2tog** =knit two stitches together

## Instructions:

With US5 double pointed needles, CO 88 sts

Work 1 x 1 rib for 10 rounds.

Switch to US7 circulars:

Next round: k1, m1, repeat (total 132 sts)

Knit 3 rounds.

Next round: \*k10, mb, repeat from \*

Knit 5 rounds.

Next round: k4, mb, \*k10, mb, repeat from \*, end k6

Knit 5 rounds.

Next round: \*k10, mb, repeat from \*

Knit 5 rounds.

Next round: k4, mb, \*k10, mb, repeat from \*, end k6

Next round: \*k10, ssk, repeat from \*

Next round: knit

Next round: \*k9, ssk, repeat from \*



Next round: knit

Next round: \*k8, ssk, repeat from \*

Next round: \*mb, k7, repeat from \*

Next round: \*k7, ssk, repeat from \*

Next round: knit

Next round: \*k6, ssk, repeat from \*

Next round: knit

Next round: \*k5, ssk, repeat from \*

Next round: k3, mb, k9, mb, k6, mb, k9, mb, k5,

mb, k9, mb, k9, mb, k2

Next round: \*k4, ssk, repeat from \*

Next round: knit

Next round: \*k3, ssk, repeat from \*

Next round: knit

Next round: \*k2, ssk, repeat from \*

Next round: k4, mb, k7, mb, k7, mb, k5, mb, k2

Next round: \*k1, ssk, repeat from \*

Next round: knit

Next round: k2tog, repeat

Cut yarn leaving a long tail; draw yarn through remaining stitches. Use long tail to attach

pompom if desired. Weave in ends.
